


News from Haslemere Museum

New Beavers Starting



Dear Parents

We are **starting our new Beaver Colony at 4.45pm on Monday 24**th **February,** at our headquarters in Beacon Hill. Beaver Scouts are for boys and girls, aged six and seven and the meetings, taking place before Cubs, will usually last for 1 hour until 5.45pm.

If you'd like your child, aged between six and eight in February to join our Beavers, then please drop Jean a line on arrickjean@gmail.com.

The exciting news is that we expect to start with between six and ten Beavers, depending upon our volunteer availability. But if we recruit enough adults, then we will be able to offer exciting 'skills for life' and lots of fun to lots more young people.

Jean has agreed to lead the Beaver Volunteer team, and so far we've recruited Katie as a member of the team. To really get going we need some more volunteers. We need to be sure, for example, that we have sufficient volunteers to be able to take our Beavers for adventures away from our headquarters.

- A couple more reasonably regular team members would be great. This means becoming a Scout member and hopefully being able to attend at least a couple of meetings each month. There will be a training commitment, but it's not terribly onerous. Five online modules that each take around 30 to 40 minutes. You'll find them under 'Growing Roots' in the learning section of scouts.org.uk if you'd like to check them out, and there's six months to complete them. And there'll be a First Response course to attend sometime. As a member of the team you'd also be involved in the planning of programme and activities.
- Some 'Helpers'. Several volunteers for whom we'll have applied for a DBS and will have completed just the Safety & Safeguarding modules. Then be available to support the leader team when possible, maybe once a month, or just to help occasionally with more 'adventurous' activities.
- As a commitment, we will be expecting all families with a child in our Beaver Colony to help once a term. We will need a parent to keep an eye on this and to make a rota, and it will be each parents responsibility if they cannot attend their meeting to arrange for someone else to help.

Please do remember, as we discussed, it doesn't have to be parents who are volunteers. *But it does depend upon parents to find volunteers*; maybe grandparents, or neighbours, or friends? And I'll add that we'd really like a few volunteers (who might not want to volunteer with our young people?) who'd like to help with maintenance & renovation of our building & land.
