School Uniform Policy

Rationale

At Grayshott Primary School, we believe that school uniform gives a sense of pride and identity and ensures all pupils share a common identity and that no-one feels outside the school family regardless of their background. We have tried to source items that will be a reasonable cost to our families; most of the items below are available from many different stockists at competitive prices. We do not want to put financial burdens on our families so we do not insist upon items with the school badge. In order to promote that sense of identity referenced above, the school jumper or cardigan with a Grayshott badge is highly recommended.

Policy

All children are expected to wear school uniform. The range of clothing which children should wear is practical and comfortable. Order forms are available from outside the school office or by following the link on the website. <https://www.pbuniform-online.co.uk/grayshott>

All items of clothing should be marked with the child's name.

Pre-loved school uniform items are often available from the PTA so please do check as this can help to cut costs and avoid waste.

Uniform

- Grey knee length skirt or pinafore dress
- Grey knee length shorts or trousers
- Grey or white shirt
- School polo-shirt or white polo shirt
- Maroon school cardigan or jumper
- Red check or gingham dress or skirt for summer
- Grey or white socks or tights

Footwear

- Sensible, low heeled black shoes.
- No open toed sandals or slip on shoes for safety reasons
- Year R children will need a named pair of wellington boots to keep at school
- Trainers should not be worn except for games lessons and at break

Hair

- Hair longer than shoulder length should be tied up at all times
- Extreme hairstyles are incompatible with the standard expected at school, this includes hair shorter than grade 2, or styles with 'tramlines' or sudden changes in length

PE and Sports Clothing

For reasons of comfort and hygiene all pupils need a change of clothing and footwear for PE. All clothing should be named.

- Black plimsolls or trainers
- White, black or maroon shorts
- Plain black, blue or grey tracksuit for outside in colder weather

- White T-shirt
- White or grey socks
- Bag for sports kit (no rucksacks)

Swimming Kit

- Swimming trunks or costumes
- Towel
- Swimming cap
- Goggles (recommended)
- Bag for swimming kit (no ruck sacks)

Jewellery

- Jewellery should not be worn at school. The only exception is if children have pierced ears then they may wear ear studs. These have to be removed for PE. Serious accidents have occurred at schools to some pupils who now have impaired hearing caused through the 'stud' puncturing the mastoid process behind the ear. Parents should teach their child to remove and replace their own ear studs or ensure ear studs are not worn to school on those days when a child has PE. If possible, please have children's ears pierced at the beginning of the summer holidays.
- Watches may be worn, but taken off for PE.
- Nail varnish should not be worn in school.

Lost Property

All clothing and property should be clearly labelled. Lost property is kept in a large, weatherproof box outside the community room. Any unclaimed, unnamed items are passed to the PTA for sale or charity at the end of each half term.

Bags

As storage space is limited the only bags in school should be

- School book bag for reading book, home school books, homework and letters.
- Lunch box.
- PE bag.
- Swimming bag for swimming days only.
- Keep other bags to a reasonable size

Please ensure that all bags are clearly named.
