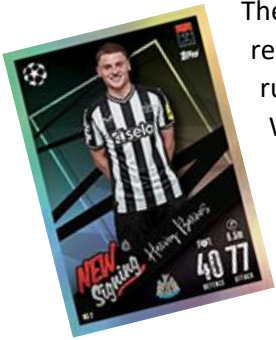

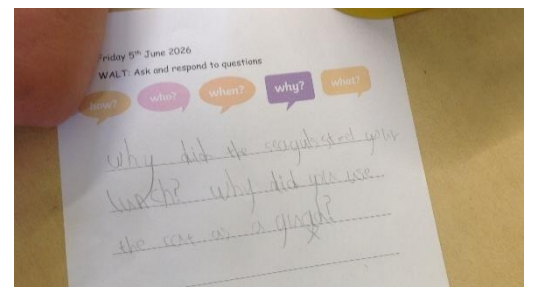
Red Class

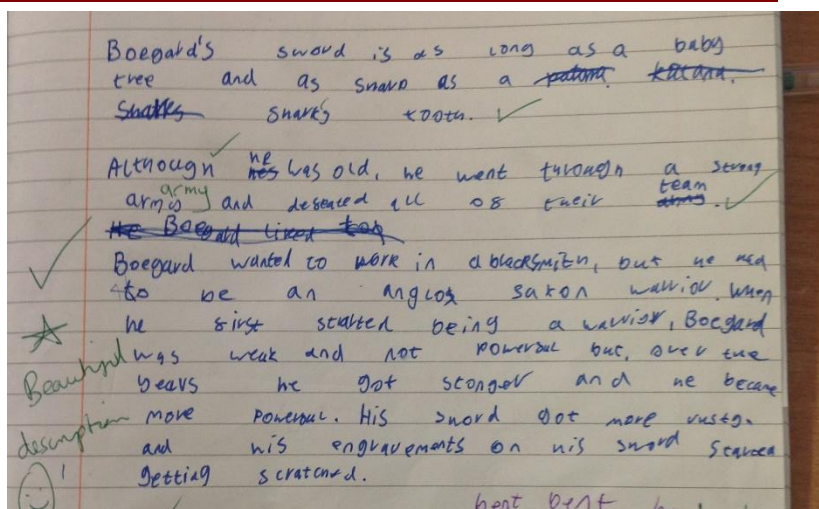
Purple Class

Purple Class will be starting their new Maths unit on mass and capacity next week. In English, they will complete their learning journey by writing a poem in the style of the book, *It Starts with a Seed*. They will also begin a final learning journey of this academic year, based on new topic Cracking Contraptions, with Wallace and Gromit as the focus of their learning

Green Class

Green Class made a massive effort learning their times tables. The children were amazing during the National Tables Check this week, superbly displaying our value of courage. Well done and congratulations! We will wait for the results. They have also been working hard on their writing skills.

Silver Class

Silver Class have begun their new English learning journey by watching the first two minutes of our text driver 'Oceanmaker' which we will use to write a setting description. They have also finished their decimal unit of maths where they have learnt to add, subtract, multiply and divide decimal numbers.

Next week, they will start looking at negative numbers, learning what they are and how to order and compare them. In Spanish they are going to learn even more types of weather building on learning from this week.

Gold Class

Gold Class have demonstrated their writing versatility by shifting from formal writing into a chatty and entertaining style. They have all written letters to Year 5 to tell them about life in Year 6 - ready for move-up day. They planned them in their books and then wrote them directly onto the computers; really impressing me with their typing speed and IT skills. They have also started to plan their fair (Friday 19th June after school) and rehearse their play (performances taking place on Tuesday 7th and Thursday 9th July).

Next week, they will be continuing to learn lines and stage directions for the play. In maths, they will continue to enjoy puzzles and games to revise their skills and apply all of their mathematical knowledge and reasoning. Science is about climate change and in computing they will continue to code with variables. Once they get 31 t-shirts in, they can start to plan their DT day too – so please bring in a t-shirt that you don't wear anymore.
