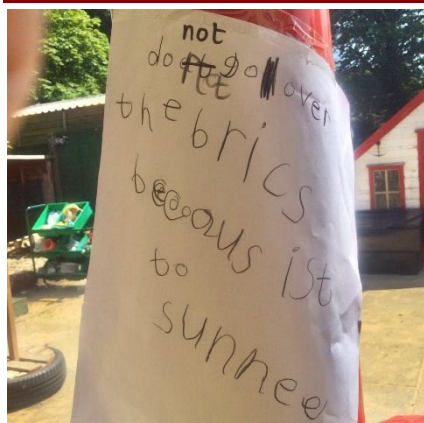

Yellow Class



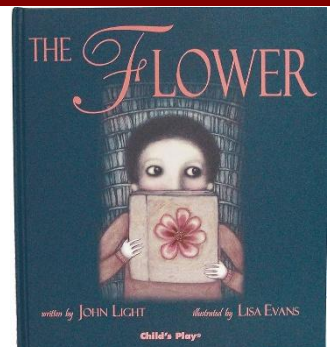

Next week, we are starting to write a diary in role as Brigg. We will be using a compass to give directions and we will be continuing with our Time unit.

Purple Class



Next week in English, **Purple Class** will learn how the Snoozatron works, they will discuss and record ideas for their own contraptions, thinking carefully about their purpose and how they operate. They will then use these ideas to plan and begin writing a similar explanation text.

In Maths, they will be starting their new topic on money. They will be learning to add and subtract amounts of money using pounds (£) and pence (p), convert between pounds and pence and solve practical problems involving money.

How you can help at home: Encourage your child to recognise coins and notes and practise counting different amounts of money. When shopping, ask them to estimate the total cost of two or three items, work out the exact total or calculate how much change they should receive from a given amount. Playing shop at home and discussing the cost of everyday items are also excellent ways to develop confidence with using money in real-life situations.

Green Class

Green Class have been working hard on their music, preparing for performance. In Maths, they have been learning about angles and trigonometry. We're very proud of how well they have been doing in their swimming sessions at St. Edmund's too.



Silver Class

Silver Class have visited Woolmer Hill to experience some secondary school lessons. In DT they have created some amazing moving images that use gears out of cardboard.

Next week, they will be continuing to learn the skills needed to write an effective narrative in English. They will also be using all the skills they have learnt in Spanish to write a weather forecast.

We're hoping that the Silver Cake Sale won't have to be postponed again – it is now on Wednesday 1st July. Cakes and biscuits will be 50p - £1.00.



Gold Class

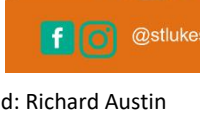
